3	A RESOLUTION OF THE LONGMONT CITY COUNCIL COMMITTING TO A VISION	
4	ZERO PROGRAM TO ACHIEVE ZERO TRAFFIC FATALITIES AND SEVERE INJURIES	
5	AMONG ALL ROAD USERS	
6		
7	WHEREAS, 42,140 motor vehicle related crashes have occurred in the City of Longmont	
8	from 2000-2021, resulting in 4,688 severe injury crashes and 92 fatalities; and	
9	WHEREAS, one traffic fatality on City streets is one too many and City leadership is	
10	dedicated to strategies that aim to reduce and eliminate deaths and serious injuries on City streets;	
11	and	
12	WHEREAS, the more vulnerable populations (people with lower incomes, seniors, youth,	
13	those with mobility issues or disabilities or simply those walking or bicycling) face an increased	
14	risk of being injured or killed; and	
15	WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges that everyone should be able to access their	
16	destination safely whether they choose to travel by motor vehicle, bicycle, foot, transit or any other	
17	micro mobility device; and	
18	WHEREAS, Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate all traffic-related deaths and serious	
19	injuries, using a data driven, multi-disciplinary, and safe systems approach that also increases	
20	safety, health and mobility.	
21	NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONGMONT, COLORADO,	
22	RESOLVES:	

1 Section 1

2 That the City Council of Longmont adopts Vision Zero as a comprehensive approach to
3 achieving the goal of zero fatalities on Longmont streets by 2040; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City shall plan and design its transportation system with the overriding goal of eliminating fatalities and serious injuries among all system users; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City convene a Vision Zero Task Force comprised of relevant City staff, and including community members representative from: Public Health sector, School District, Affordable housing, Urban development and are able to integrate key components of Vision Zero, including but not limited to engineering, enforcement, education, and communications; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that City staff develop a comprehensive Vision Zero Action Plan that summarizes specific changes to policies standards, enforcement, procedures, education efforts, infrastructure improvements, and other action items to be taken by City departments and that will reduce speeding and reduce collisions and thereby demonstrating efforts to move the City towards zero fatalities and serious injuries; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all City transportation projects include a Vision Zero
 evaluation based on their benefit to lowering overall severe and fatal crashes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Vision Zero will be implemented in an equitable
 manner throughout the City, taking into account all users; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that City staff prepare and provide an annual report to City Council to relay progress on Vision Zero Action Plan as well as track crash metrics and the impact of Plan implementation.
